Intent at delivery of grain: There is <u>NO FREE TIME!</u> Load must be marked as Contracted, Sold, Price Later, or Grain Bank before being unloaded.

WE DO NOT PROCESS WAREHOUSE RECEIPTS OR CCC LOANS RECEIPTS!

<u>Checks are issued per request on Tuesdays & Thursdays. Please give notice to us for any</u> <u>deferred payment arrangements.</u>

Moisture allowance: 2 yellow is calculated to 15% moisture. *You will be assessed a drying charge and shrink if moisture is higher than 15%.* Drying fees will be \$.04 cents per point of moisture. Shrink factor will be 1.4% for each point of moisture removed. Loads of corn delivered to the feed mill in Mapleton must be at 15% maximum moisture or it will be rejected.

Quality control: There is zero tolerance for damage on corn delivered to the mill. We want happy, healthy hogs!

On-Farm Pickup. Call Tom Massop at the Good Thunder office for quotes & arrangements.

Grain Bank: The first 60 days have no banking fees. A fee of \$.04 cents/month/bushel for the end of the months balance will be charged thereafter through each month into March.

Bean Delivery: Accepted at Good Thunder and Mapleton Elevator or by farm pickup. Beans at 13.1 % moisture or higher will be discounted. We will average the moisture at 14% and below. Beans above 14% will stand-alone and moisture will be discounted separately.

Price Later Fees: Grain put on Price Later Contracts will be charged \$.04 cents/month/bushel fee with a minimum fee of .15 cents per bushel. <u>This charge is subject</u> to change after our space is full. We will then charge the prevailing commercial industry rate!

Defer Pay: Is available upon request for grain that was contracted or sold, payable on Friday January 3rd, 2017.
